
(Fig.1) Using the <u>Smyrna Cross Stitches</u>, fill in the canvas surface as shown. Read notes for <u>Smyrna Cross Stitch</u>.

Use 2-3 ply yarn of the same color as the background yarn in Fig.1. Read the **Overcast Stitch** notes.




Another option for overcasting the edge would be to pick one of the colors from the variegated yarn and use it as a solid color to overcast the edge. In the above photo you might use a solid color yarn of either blue, yellow, pink or white.





This stitch is used to completely cover the edge of the canvas. It may be necessary to go thru the same hole more than once to get an even coverage on the edge, especially at the corners. <u>Use an even tension and be gentle on the outer corners</u>. <u>Too much yarn or pulling too tight can break open the slanted corners</u>; if this happens you'll need to stitch into the surrounding 3 holes to round the corner as smoothly as possible.

Overcast Stitch

This stitch is used to completely cover the edge of the canvas. It may be necessary to go thru the same hole more than once to get an even coverage on the edge, especially at the corners. Use an even tension and be gentle on the outer corners. Too much yarn or pulling too tight can break open the slanted corners; if this happens you'll need to stitch into the surrounding 3 holes to round the corner as smoothly as possible.




(Fig.1) Using the <u>Smyrna Cross Stitches</u>, fill in the canvas surface as shown. Read notes for <u>Smyrna Cross Stitch</u>.





(Fig.1) Using the <u>Smyrna Cross Stitches</u>, fill in the canvas surface as shown. Read notes for <u>Smyrna Cross Stitch.</u>




(Fig.1) Using the <u>Tent Stitch</u> and <u>Gobelin</u> <u>Stitches</u>, fill in the canvas surface as shown.


(Fig.1) Following the <u>Back Stitch</u> notes below, fill in the canvas surface as shown.


(Fig.2) Following the <u>Star Stitch</u> notes below, top-stitch the center design in 2-4 ply yellow yarn.


(Fig.1) Following the <u>Back Stitch</u> notes below, fill in the canvas surface as shown.






(Fig.1) Following the <u>Back Stitch</u> notes below, fill in the canvas surface as shown.


(Fig.1) Following the <u>Back Stitch</u> notes below, fill in the canvas surface as shown using 1-2 ply pearlized mint green yarn.


(Fig.2) Following the <u>Gobelin Stitch</u> notes below, top-stitch the center design using 2-4 ply peach yarn.







(Fig.1) Following the <u>Back Stitch</u> notes below, fill in the canvas surface as shown using 1-2 ply pearlized mint green yarn.
